

Join Friendship Home's Monthly Giving Program

The need for our services is rising. We serve more individuals each year than in previous years, and we don't anticipate a drop in those numbers. Did you know that we served 1,664 survivors and their children in 2023 but still have a daily waiting list of people seeking safe shelter? It is an ever-growing challenge to meet the needs of those we serve. Thankfully, we have friends like you who stand shoulder-to-shoulder with us to help those fleeing domestic violence.

At Friendship Home, our monthly giving program helps provide a predictable stream of resources each month, allowing us to focus on client services and needs. This gives us stability to offer each survivor services unique to their circumstance and help them plan for their future.

Your set monthly gift reminds a survivor staying in one of our shelters that a person is out there dedicated to their journey and safety. Every gift makes a difference, whether \$10.00 or \$100.00; it matters to us and the individual's seeking safety through us.

If you choose to join our monthly giving program, we encourage you to reach out to your employer, as many companies offer a matching gift program where they provide a financial match based on your donation. It's an easy and simple way to double your gift to Friendship Home.

From the Executive Director

Safe shelter is one of the most basic needs that we have as human beings. Imagine what life would be like without the comfort of your home. Think for a moment about what makes this need so important to you and those in your family. For most of us, it comes back to safety, comfort, and warmth. You cannot feel emotionally safe if you do not have physical safety.

One of the most significant barriers to leaving an abusive relationship is access to safe, affordable housing. For many survivors, the need for safe shelter is not met, furthering feelings of hurt and fear. Without a safe place to stay, many survivors feel their only option is to stay with their abusive partner.

Friendship Home is shaped by the voices of those who have come through our doors in the past. Over the last few years, we have heard from survivors who have said they need more time to find a home that they can afford for themselves and their children. By listening to survivors, we can adjust how we provide services to serve best those who come to us for help.

Friendship Home is adding seven units to our rapid re-housing program this year, creating 29 total units. Those participating in this program are provided with financial support, case management, and assistance in obtaining benefits. These benefits include connections to health care, daily living services, legal referrals, childcare, and counseling services.

Friendship Home's mission says we provide a continuum of care from emergency shelter to transitional shelter and sometimes after. Knowing that a stay of 6 weeks is not enough time to find employment and safe housing or to heal from the trauma brought on by domestic violence. Because of this input, we have expanded our services to meet the needs of those who have stayed with us.

While we dream of a day when our services are no longer needed, we count it a privilege to be here still providing safe futures for adults and children facing domestic violence. Thank you for being a friend of Friendship Home.

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Growth Through Focusing on Strengths

For over 20 years, Friendship Home has been offering the Clifton Strengths Finder to survivors coming into shelter. The strengths tool, created by the Gallup Organization, allows individuals to identify their strengths and allows advocates a unique way to understand and help them reach their potential.

Strengths-based advocacy has flourished at Friendship Home. For so many survivors, their abusers had taken these same strengths and twisted them into weaknesses. Our advocates work tirelessly with survivors to use their strengths to achieve attainable, short-term goals, gaining a sense of accomplishment as they stretch to meet more complicated goals.

In 2008, Friendship Home's staff extended the StrengthsFinder to children. Intended for kids ages 10-14, it has become instrumental in helping kids see the positive in themselves and others. Since beginning strength-based advocacy, we have seen a change in survivors and their children. Parents and children can develop a deeper connection and understand each other more effectively.

Celebrating 25 years of Stuff the Bus!

Planned Giving at Friendship Home

At Friendship Home, we are fortunate to have a team that is dedicated to providing efficient and unique ways to donate to our mission, such as planned giving from your retirement account. Planned Giving is a simple, cost-effective way to support Friendship Home and receive tax benefits.

If you are over the age of 70, you can gift up to \$100,000 from your IRA to a qualified charity, like Friendship Home, and avoid income taxes while also counting toward your Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs). A key benefit of planned giving from your IRA is that you can make your charitable donation without incurring any taxes from your distributions.
